Abortion: Mostly ban or mostly legal?	Mostly Ban. Has signed restrictions requiring doctors to ask if abortion is related to rape, incest, or domestic violence; telling patients that effect of abortion pills can be undone; & banning use of Obamacare exchanges for abortion insurance.	Legal. "As governor, I'll veto anti- abortion bills & work to overturn laws that erode any rights to make our own personal health care decisions."
Campaign Finance Reform: Should there be restrictions or disclosure requirements on large and anonymous political donations?
