Abortion: Mostly ban or mostly legal?	Legal. Led efforts to weaken 20-week abortion ban & to block TARP (Targeted Restrictions on Abortion Providers). "Staunch defender of reproduction choices."	Ban. Supports "Heartbeat Bill" outlawing abortions after 6 weeks. As governor, will "sign the toughest abortion laws in the country."
Climate Change: Consider climate change a critical threat?	Yes. "It is vitally important that we do everything we can to help fight climate change." Renewable energy is central to her economic development plan.	No stand found.
<b>Contraception</b> : Allow employers to withhold contraceptive coverage from employees if disagree with it morally?	No specific stand, but opposes Judge Kavanaugh for potentially jeopardizing  "access to birth control."	Yes. As governor, will sign a "religious freedom" bill that would allow withholding of contraceptive coverage.
Courts: Support President Trump's Supreme Court nomination of Brett Kavanaugh?	No. "Georgians should be deeply troubled by [his] track record."	Yes. Applauds Trump's choice. Kavanagh <u>"will serve our country well."</u>
<b>Economy:</b> Support Trump's imposition of tariffs on Chinese steel & other products?	No. They are <u>"a terrible idea"</u> & have triggered major concerns in many sectors of the Georgia economy.	"Supports whatever decision the president makes on delicate trade negotiations."
Education: Increase funding for K-12 education?	Yes. Make necessary investments to reduce long-term costs & increase long-term return on investment.	Yes. Vows to "fully fund public school education."
<b>Education:</b> Support publicy funded vouchers or tax breaks to help parents send children to private schools?	No. Opposes vouchers for private schools & unchecked expansion of charter schools.	Yes. Supports vouchers to attend private schools & expanding charter schools.
<b>Education:</b> Increase state funding for higher education?	Yes. Includes needs-based aid for low- income students, restoring tuition-free certificates, and funding Georgia 2025 program.	No stand found.
<b>Elections:</b> Support nonpartisan redistricting to address charges of partisan gerrymandering?	Yes. Voting rights platform supports nonpartisan redistricting commission to create fair districts.	No stand found.
Gay Marriage: Support gay marriage?	Yes. First endorsed marriage equality in 2006.	Unknown. Supports business owners choosing not to serve gay customers on religious grounds.

<b>Gun Control:</b> Support more restrictive gun control legislation?	Yes. Supports requiring universal background checks; banning assault weapons; establishing protective risk orders plus laws for domestic violence situations, & repealing campus carry.	No. Opposes new gun control restrictions, supports campus carry, arming K-12 teachers, & "constitutional carry" without permit or application. In humorous ad, pointed a shotgun at teenage boy sitting next to him, saying dating his daughters required appreciating the Second Amendment.
Healthcare: Support or Repeal ACA, aka Obamacare? Accept ACA's Medicaid expansion to subsidize low-income participants?	Supports ACA. Led efforts to expand Medicaid, which is "transformative for our state."	Repeal ACA. "[It] is an absolute disaster & needs to be repealed immediately." Opposes Medicaid expansion.
<b>Healthcare:</b> Require people to work to receive Medicaid?	No.	Yes.
Immigration: Support DACA, allowing "Dreamers" who arrived illegally as children, then grew up in the US, to achieve legal status if meet certain conditions?	Yes. Advocates a clean DREAM Act legislation with path to citizenship.	No. End DACA, which <u>"provides</u> amnesty for illegal immigrants—many of whom are adults, not children, & includes those with criminal records."
<b>Immigration:</b> Support path to citizenship for America's 11 million illegal immigrants?	No stand found.	No. In <u>ad</u> , said he wants to round up "criminal illegals" in his pickup & take them home himself. Will crack down on illegal immigration.
Marijuana: Legalize or decriminalize marijuana?	Supports medical use and decriminalization of small amounts for recreational use as <u>"a critical step to criminal justice reform."</u>	"Unequivocally" opposes recreational use. Supports limited medical use.
Minimum Wage: Raise the minimum wage?	Yes. Raise state minimum wage to \$15/hr.	No stand found.
President Trump: Response to President Trump's actions & policies?	Strong opponent, consistently questions policies & actions.	Endorsed by Trump in primary. Vocal supporter who shares many of the same policy goals. Vows to "unapologetically stand with" Trump.
Renewable Energy: Support government subsidies for renewable energy?	Yes. Co-sponsored multiple bills providing financial incentives for solar, biomass, & wind. Advanced Energy Jobs Plan centers on creating a Green Bank to spur investment in renewables.	No stand found.
Voting Rights: Support stricter voting rules such as voter ID requirements or reduced registration times, even if they prevent some people from voting?	No. <u>Detailed voting rights platform</u> includes nonpartisan redistricting commission; online, automatic, & same-day registration; & early voting.	Yes. Stricter voter ID laws prevent fraud & "threat of illegal voters casting ballots." Has been named in 3 lawsuits over election policies opponents claim "disproportionately harm Georgia's growing number of minority voters."

Other candidates for governor include <u>Ted Metz</u> (Libertarian) & <u>Larry Odom</u> (Independent). Due to limited space, we can include only responses of candidates who poll over 15%, but encourage you to check out their websites.
