AFFORDABLE CARE ACT Support Affordable Care Act (ACA), known as Obamacare? Support expansion of Medicaid to more low- income citizens?	Yes. Repealing the ACA <u>"may be even worse</u> than previous proposals." Supports Medicaid expansion: <u>"Should be one of the easiest</u> decisions a policymaker can make."	No. Opposes the expansion of Medicaid. <u>"The government's just not best suited for these kinds of delivery mechanisms.</u> They need to be in private hands."
CAMPAIGN FINANCE Campaigns must disclose large funders?	Yes. <u>Vetoed a bill that made it harder to prosecute campaign finance violations</u> .	No position found, but in 2017 a super-PAC backing him as lieutenant governor received a \$1 million donation from a single donor.
CLIMATE CHANGE Consider human-caused climate change a serious threat?	Yes. Climate change <u>"makes storms larger</u> and more powerful and intensifies heavy rainfalls and droughts. North Carolinians, unfortunately, know this the hard way."	No. Climate change is "the religion of the left," along with Black Lives Matter, Me Too and gun control.
CLIMATE CHANGE Address as a top priority by taxing or limiting output of greenhouse gases?	Yes. Wants tax credits for electric cars and to reduce emissions from electric power generation to 70% of 2005 levels by 2030.	No. Lower state gas tax, expand gas and oil extraction onshore and offshore. State "should strive to be energy independent."
SUPREME COURT Support Brett Kavanaugh nomination?	No position found.	Yes. Kavanaugh knows "the Constitution is not a living, breathing document."
COVID-19 Tighten or loosen restrictions to control pandemic?	Tighten. Has been cautious in lifting restrictions. Implemented program to provide financial help to those told to isolate. Local school districts choose mix of online and in-person, with restrictions, or all online.	Loosen. Fewer restrictions. Initially sued Cooper over restrictions. Allow "counties with no virus at all" "to still flourish." Opposes restrictions like required mask wearing and staggered schedules for schools.
EDUCATION Use public funding for private and/or for-profit schools?	No. Opposes "vouchers because of the lack of accountability Instead, we need to invest in our public schools."	Yes. Increase public funding for charter schools. Expand vouchers to pay for private schools, "giving more choices to parents."
ENVIRONMENT Tighten or loosen environmental regulations?	Tighten. <u>"We've ordered Duke Energy to dig</u> up remaining coal ash ponds in North Carolina." Forced TVA to clean up emissions.	Loosen. Asked Trump EPA to eliminate Obama clean water rules. "There is a place for good regulatory policy but I also believe in innovation over regulation."
FINANCIAL REGULATION Tighten or loosen regulations of banks and credit card companies?	Tighten. Pushed to pass <u>first U.S. antipredatory lending law and financial fraud protections</u> .	Loosen. "Having fewer regulations fosters a spirit of innovation in our state."

GUN RULES Enact more restrictive legislation on guns, such as more background checks, or "red flag" laws.	Yes. Signed executive directive strengthening background checks. Pushed for legislation on gun safety and red flag protection orders, prohibiting ownership by individuals who are a danger to themselves or others.	No. Supports Second Amendment sanctuaries exempt from gun laws. "Yet to see a 'red flag' bill that adequately protects the constitutional rights of law-abiding Americans."
IMMIGRATION Create path to citizenship for DACA residents brought to U.S. as children?	Yes. Signed letter with 10 other governors to the leaders of the U.S. House and Senate, urging extension of DACA program.	No position found.
IMMIGRATION Support tighter immigration restrictions?	No. Vetoed bill requiring sheriffs to cooperate with ICE. Would hurt ability of local law enforcement <u>"to protect their counties."</u>	Yes. Local sheriffs should be cooperating with federal agencies like ICE <u>"to keep violent, illegal criminals from being arbitrarily released back into our communities."</u>
LEGAL ABORTION Keep legal or ban?	Legal. <u>Vetoed</u> bill imposing prison time on doctors who don't revive a fetus that survives an abortion. It would <u>"criminalize" them for</u> <u>"a practice that simply does not exist."</u>	Ban. Is running as a "pro-life leader." "I firmly believe that the day is going to come in America where we're going to look back on abortion just like slavery."
LGBTQ RIGHTS Support LGBTQ rights, including samesex marriage and protection from discrimination on sexual orientation?	Yes. Supports marriage equality. Opposed bill invalidating same-sex marriage. Signed order prohibiting discrimination for "sexual orientation, gender identity or expression."	No. Accepts same-sex marriage as "law of the land." But a child raised by "a mother and a father" has "greater potential in life." Nothing found on discrimination protection.
LGBTQ RIGHTS Support HB2, bill requiring transgender people to use bathroom corresponding to the sex on their birth certificate?	No. Opposed, <u>called it a "dark cloud." Signed compromise repeal</u> .	Yes. Opposed repeal of bill: Called pressure from NCAA <u>"a new form of corporate"</u> extortion from an unaccountable, out-of-state, non-elected, tax-exempt organization."
MINIMUM WAGE Raise state hourly minimum wage above current \$7.25?	Yes. Will "work with the General Assembly to see how high we can get it. \$15 is an admirable goal."	No recent position found. In 2012 called minimum wage laws <u>"an unfair intrusion into the labor market" that "hurt the employment opportunities for unskilled labor."</u>
PLANNED PARENTHOOD Can Planned Parenthood receive public funds for non-abortion-related care?	Yes. Signed letter with other governors opposing administration efforts <u>"to gut women's access to family planning services."</u>	No. <u>"Planned Parenthood was created to destroy the entire black race."</u> Has said the state should not fund the organization.
POLICE/COMMUNITY ISSUES Restrict police use of force and increase public oversight?	Yes. <u>Created task force on racial equity in criminal justice</u> and a new center to <u>track statistics and "improve training related to the use of force."</u>	No. "I will always DEFEND the police." "Our police officers need to be able to do their jobs."
TAXES Support increase in state taxes?	Preserve tax base. "When business has a choice between further cuts in corporate taxes or investments in our teachers, I hope you will say investments in our teachers."	No. Signed the "Tax Protection Pledge" pledging to oppose and veto any and all efforts to pass a net tax hike.
VOTING RULES Support stricter ID requirements and other rules on voting?	No. Voter ID <u>"is a solution for no problem."</u> <u>Vetoed bill that would set "barriers to voting that will trap honest voters."</u>	Yes. "The only reason to oppose photo voter ID is if you intend to commit fraud at the ballot box."
