No. Opposed Warren bill because of tax increase for people making over \$1 million. Proposed 2013 budget amendment that lowered Pell Grant funding & required higher payments for school loans.	Yes. Taxes: Support President Trump's tax cuts?	Yes. Played key role in crafting plan. Would make individual tax cuts permanent.	No. <u>Disproportionately benefit wealthy</u> with 83% of breaks going to top 1%. <u>Trickle-down economics doesn't work.</u>
<b>Voting Rights:</b> Support stricter voting rules such as voter ID requirements, even if they prevent some people from voting?	Yes. "Commonsense protection" "to prevent illegal voter fraud." Supported TX voter ID law which federal court rejected, comparing to a "poll tax" on minorities.	No. "It's deeply cynical" for Texas to implement laws that knowingly make it more difficult for African-American & Latino voters to cast their ballots."
