Abortion: Mostly ban or mostly legal?	Ban. Life begins at conception. Supports ban after 20 weeks. Voted to permanently ban the use of federal funds for abortion or health coverage that includes abortions.	Legal. Campaign Finance: Strengthen campaign donation disclosure rules? Stand on <i>Citizens United</i> decision, allowing unlimited political donations from corporations and unions?
