ABORTION Ban or legal?	Legal. Overturning Roe v. Wade is <u>"a direct</u> <u>attack on women and 100% unacceptable."</u> Supports <u>a woman's right to full autonomy</u> . Opposes limits to abortion such as <u>parental</u> <u>consent or defining fetal viability</u> ; <u>"the woman</u> <u>and her doctor"</u> should decide.	Mostly ban. <u>Voted against</u> a bill prohibiting govern- ment restrictions on abortion rights. Supports the overturning of Roe v. Wade as <u>"flawed precedent;"</u> <u>"the unalienable right to life must be protected."</u> But calls restricting travel for abortions <u>"unconstitutional."</u>
CLIMATE CHANGE Should climate change be a top priority? Tax or limit the output of greenhouse gases, or support renewable energy?	Yes. <u>"Climate change is the most clear and direct</u> <u>threat to the survival of our planet and the</u> <u>future of our children and grandchildren.</u> " Supports a carbon tax, wind and solar power, and <u>"carbon-reduction goals for the farm sector.</u> "	Mixed. Supports <u>biofuels</u> and <u>wind energy tax</u> <u>credits</u> . Sponsored the Growing Climate Solutions Act to <u>encourage carbon trapping on farms</u> . Supports <u>easing regulations on oil and gas</u> <u>production</u> for energy independence.
ECONOMY Decrease or increase government investment in, and regulation of, the economy?	Increase. Would <u>"break up monopolies and</u> <u>deconcentrate agribusiness,"</u> and <u>"advance</u> <u>policies that create equity."</u> Wants <u>a better</u> <u>electric grid and more funding for public education.</u>	Mixed. Voted for the <u>Infrastructure Investment and</u> Jobs Act. Voted against the <u>American Rescue Plan</u> stimulus; <u>"it wasn't a good spend." Voted against</u> the <u>Inflation Reduction Act</u> , with <u>major public</u> <u>investments</u> ; it will <u>"hurt American agriculture."</u>
EDUCATION How to address the teaching of issues around race and gender identity?	No response found.	<u>Critical race theory is "divisive"</u> and separates <u>"groups</u> of Americans into different degrees of oppressor and <u>oppressed."</u> The US needs education that is <u>"accurate,</u> <u>honest</u> , unifying, inspiring, and ennobling."
ENVIRONMENT Loosen or tighten environmental regulations?	Tighten. Says Iowa can be a <u>"fabulous spot for</u> <u>environmental concerns"</u> by developing wind, solar, and ethanol for electricity. Would <u>"advance environmental justice,"</u> and see <u>"soil</u> <u>and water stewardshipadequately incentivized"</u> <u>in the 2023 farm bill.</u>	Loosen. Sponsored the American Energy Independence Act of 2022 to <u>ease regulations on</u> <u>energy production</u> and pull the US from the Paris Climate Agreement. <u>Voted to repeal the Stream</u> <u>Protection Rule</u> that had protected waterways from coal mining waste.
GUN RULES Pass less or more restrictive legislation on guns?	More. Supports <u>a combination of background</u> <u>checks and gun education</u> used by the US military. <u>"I'm not anti-gun. I'm a gun owner. But</u> <u>I'm a responsible gun owner."</u> Suggests <u>"fingerprinting a firearm" for ballistics and</u> <u>"tracking it through its life."</u>	Less. <u>Voted against the Bipartisan Safer</u> <u>Communities Act</u> which <u>expands background</u> <u>checks and funds state-level red-flag laws</u> . Had <u>"specific concerns about safeguarding</u> <u>constitutional due process rights"</u> that prevented him from supporting the bill.
HEALTH CARE Increase government role in health care, such as expanding Medicaid, limiting drug prices, or promoting COVID safety?	Yes. Supports <u>"all-encompassing" health care for</u> <u>all Americans</u> . Supports <u>expansion of Medicare</u> to children under 5 and adults over 50. Supports <u>reducing prescription drug prices</u> . Says COVID-19 vaccine mandate for military personnel has <u>saved lives</u> .	Mixed. <u>Has voted to repeal Affordable Care Act.</u> Introduced bills to <u>enhance access to life-saving</u> <u>care for children</u> with complex medical conditions, and <u>lower some prescription drug prices</u> . Opposes <u>"the heavy hand of federal govt mandating the</u> <u>vaccine on private biz."</u>

IMMIGRATION How to handle immigration? Support a path to citizenship for "DACA" participants brought to the US as children?	Says <u>"Trump's wall is idiotic."</u> Supports <u>redoubling</u> <u>"efforts to increase immigration"</u> and <u>protecting</u> <u>DACA "DREAMers."</u>	Is against Biden's "open borders;" <u>"every one of</u> them" crossing the border is "violating our laws." Supports citizenship for DACA Dreamers. <u>"The kids"</u> can't "be held responsible for" their parents' actions.
LABOR Make it easier or harder for unions to organize?	Easier. "Will always stand with teachers and unions" and "UAW (the United Auto Workers) and their workers." Is "a big fan of union rights" and says "This is the time to invest in unions, and we will all be better for it."	Harder. <u>Opposed PRO Act</u> that expands workers' rights to organize and collectively bargain. <u>Co-sponsored National Right-to-Work Act</u> to end, at a national level, the practice of requiring of union membership as a condition of employment.
LGBTQ RIGHTS Limit or expand LGBTQ rights?	Expand. For <u>preserving and expanding</u> "equality" and lowa's legacy as <u>one of the first states</u> "to <u>legalize gay marriage.</u> " Supports the <u>bill</u> to codify same-sex marriage. <u>"It's a God-given right that we</u> <u>should have someone we love as our partner in life.</u> <u>So of course we should codify"</u> same-sex marriage.	Less. <u>Opposes Equality Act</u> that <u>"prohibits</u> <u>discrimination based on sex, sexual orientation."</u> In 2015: <u>"Marriage is between one man and one</u> <u>woman." Voted against</u> reauthorizing the <u>Violence</u> <u>Against Women Act</u> in 2013; shelters haven't been shown to refuse services to people <u>"on the basis of</u> <u>sexual orientation or gender identity."</u>
MARIJUANA Ban or legal?	Legal. <u>"Remove cannabis as a Schedule controlled</u> <u>substanceand legalize it at the Federal level."</u> Medicinal or "recreational use" of marijuana, controlled like alcohol, is <u>"absolutely fine and</u> <u>well overdue."</u>	Ban. <u>"There is unfortunately not enough research</u> into the impacts of marijuana use in the long term;" supports <u>education and prevention</u> . <u>Sponsored bill</u> to study medical impact. Says recreational use, <u>"particularly for adolescent or pregnant users," can</u> <u>be harmful or addictive.</u>
MINIMUM WAGE Keep or raise the federal minimum from \$7.25 per hour? If raise, how much?	Raise to <u>\$15 per hour. "A family of one" can't</u> <u>"live on minimum wage"</u> today. Says with \$15 minimum wage, <u>"31% of Iowans" would see a</u> <u>boosted pay and "64% of those" are women.</u>	Raise to \$9.75 or \$10.25 to match inflation from the last minimum wage increase in 2007. Says a raise to \$15 could lose <u>1.4 million jobs. Voted</u> against the minimum wage amendment (to \$15 by 2025) in the COVID-19 relief bill.
POLICE AND COMMUNITY How to address police use of force?	The criminal justice system <u>unfairly penalizes</u> <u>"black and brown communities."</u> But is not <u>"a</u> <u>defund the police person."</u> Called for <u>an</u> <u>investigation into the police officers involved in</u> <u>George Floyd's death.</u>	Opposes <u>defunding the police</u> . Was <u>"outraged"</u> at George Floyd's death, <u>police brutality and racism</u> <u>must be addressed</u> . Co-sponsored bill to <u>encourage</u> <u>ending chokeholds</u> . <u>Opposes</u> federal standards on police conduct.
STUDENT FINANCIAL AID Support lowering interest on student loans or forgiving them?	Yes to lower interest. Supports <u>zero interest loans</u> for education. Mixed on forgiveness. <u>"We need to</u> <u>be very careful about loan forgiveness."</u> Cancelling student debt could increase <u>college costs</u> . Supports <u>national service loan forgiveness programs</u> .	No position found on interest. Introduced a <u>bill</u> <u>indexing for inflation the tax deduction on student</u> <u>loan interest.</u> Introduced bills to <u>provide clearer</u> <u>information</u> on future student loan payments. No on loan forgiveness. <u>"Cancelling debt is not the solution."</u>
TAXES Should corporations and wealthier individuals pay less or more taxes?	More. Supports <u>capital gains taxes on some assets</u> , <u>and removing the cap on income that is taxed to</u> <u>fund Social Security</u> . Supports the Inflation Reduction Act, <u>with tax increases on corporations</u> . Some billionaires <u>"have not been paying their fair</u> <u>share."</u> <u>"Repeal the top Trump tax breaks."</u>	Less. <u>Voted for the 2017 act</u> that <u>cut the corporate</u> <u>tax from 35 % to 21%</u> . Has supported <u>eliminating</u> <u>federal estate tax</u> . <u>Opposed</u> the <u>American Families</u> <u>Plan</u> , which would increase the top tax rate, close tax loopholes, and stiffen reporting requirements on high-income investments.
VOTING RULES Support tightened restrictions on such voting rules as absentee and early voting, and voter ID?	No. Supports <u>"maximum voter participation."</u> Supports the John Lewis Voting Rights Act, which would require federal pre-clearance from states with a history of voting rights violations, before making voting law changes.	Yes. <u>Voted against</u> the John Lewis Voting Rights Act, saying <u>"It penalizes states for voter ID laws."</u> Says the bill <u>wrongly assumes voting law changes in</u> <u>states lead to "voter suppression."</u> Opposes <u>"federalizing elections."</u>
