

How to Vote in Georgia's U.S. Senate Runoff Election — December 6, 2022

DATES & DEADLINES

Monday, November 28

Deadline for requesting an absentee ballot.
(Apply as soon as you can to make sure you receive a ballot in time.)



Tuesday, December 6 at 7:00 p.m.

Deadline for an absentee ballot to be received at your county election office.

Monday, November 28
(Saturday, November 26 in some counties)

Early in-person voting begins.



Friday, December 2

Early in-person voting

Tuesday, December 6, 2022
7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Runoff Election Day
(If you are in line by 7:00 p.m., you are allowed to cast your ballot.)

Here's how you can vote in Georgia's December 6 runoff election, which will determine whether Herschel Walker or Raphael Warnock wins the state's U.S. Senate seat. You must have been registered by **November 7** to vote in this election.

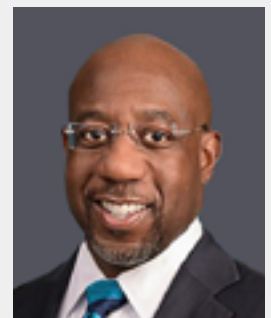

Absentee Voting

- In Georgia you can vote **absentee** without giving any reason. You need to apply again even if you just voted absentee for the **November 8** election.
- You can apply for an absentee ballot [online or download and mail an application form](#). Apply as soon as you can. And make sure to sign and date your application with a pen.
- When you apply, you'll need to include the number from your driver's license or your state-issued ID card, or a copy or photo of one the IDs or documents [listed here](#).
- You'll then need to mail your absentee ballot back, making sure that it will get to your county election office by **December 6**.
- You can also hand-deliver it to your [county registrar](#), or place it in your county's drop box. Your county registrar should have drop box location(s).

Early Voting in Person

- You can also **vote early in person**, bringing valid photo ID (see below), starting on **Monday, November 28** (or possibly earlier).
- **Note:** While early voting begins on **November 28** in all counties, some counties may begin on **Saturday, November 26** or **Sunday, November 27**. To find advance-voting days, locations, and hours for your county, see [your county election office](#).

Voting in Person on December 6

- Find your polling place.

ID Requirements to Vote

When voting in person, whether on Election Day or in early voting, you must show one of these forms of photo ID:

- Any valid state or federal government-issued photo ID, including a free ID Card from your county registrar's office or the Georgia Department of Driver Services.
- A Georgia Driver's License, even if expired.
- A student ID from [most](#) Georgia 2- and 4-year public colleges, but **not** from private colleges. Your ID must have a photo and be unexpired.
- Valid employee photo ID from any branch, department or agency of the US government, Georgia, or any county, municipality, board, authority, or other entity of Georgia.
- Valid US passport, military photo ID, or tribal photo ID.
