ABORTION Ban or legal?	Mostly ban. Supports a 20-week ban unless the mother's health is at risk or "there's something terribly wrong with the baby." Voted six times in the General Assembly against funding Planned Parenthood family planning services.	Legal. "I have always fought for access to abortion and comprehensive reproductive health care."  Would enshrine abortion rights into the New Jersey Constitution. "Will stockpile the abortion pill, mifepristone," and strengthen NJ shield laws for reproductive health care providers.
CLIMATE CHANGE Should climate change be a top priority?	Mixed. "Will ban offshore wind farms" and "withdraw New Jersey from the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative." "Climate change is real." Wants an "all-of-the-above energy policy," including natural gas and nuclear.	Yes. "The climate crisis is real, addressing it isn't a partisan issue." Would streamline clean energy project approvals and use state land properties for solar. Supports offshore wind. Voted for \$369 billion in clean energy investments.
CRIMINAL JUSTICE How to ensure effectiveness and fairness in law enforcement?	Supports expanding community policing and protecting qualified immunity for police, which protects officers against lawsuits. Opposes civilian review boards. Would "recruit more women and persons of color."	Would fund "smart policing strategies" and develop "trust between law enforcement and the communities that they serve." Wants "support and resources" for police officers and funding "reentry services" for people in the criminal justice system.
ECONOMY Decrease or increase government investment in the economy?	Mostly decrease. Would "reduce state spending by 30%" and "create the NJ Department of Government Efficiency (NJDOGE)." In 2021 wanted to secure "federal and state investment" and "upgrade infrastructure," and supported funding the Gateway Project.	Increase. Would invest in "New Jersey's aging roads and bridges." Has "been a staunch advocate for the Gateway Project to build new rail tunnels under the Hudson River." Will "adopt a whole-ofgovernment strategy to support entrepreneurs, develop our startup community." Voted for infrastructure funding.
EDUCATION Limit teaching about racism and gender identity?	Yes. Students need to be taught that "that slavery was central to the Civil War." But "we are not going to teach that white people perpetuate systemic racism." Will "reform requirements for sexual and social education to make content age-appropriate." "Will implement a true Parents' Bill of Rights." "We're going to roll back the LGBTQ curriculum. It goes too far."	Likely no. Voted against the Parents Bill of Rights Act. Suggested that while "parents have a right to opt out of a lot of things" they shouldn't opt out of teaching their children about historical contributions of LGBTQ people. In 2021 said, "Racism permeates everyday life in the United States. School segregation is at the same levels as the 1960s."
EDUCATION Priorities for pre-K and K-12 education?	Would "expand charter schools" and loosen restrictions on school choice, with a school voucher program. Would "set a statewide standard on per-pupil spending and then allow that money to follow the student." Would "coordinate the expansion of pre-K utilizing existing private day care providers."	Would <u>offer more</u> apprenticeships and expand job training programs. "Will work to protect funding for our public schools and students." <u>Supports</u> funding of "high-impact tutoring programs in K-12 schools." Would <u>make</u> "early childhood education, pre-K, and kindergarten affordable and available everywhere in New Jersey."
